Make your own daffodil

Make a field of daffodil flowers this Daffodil Day in your classroom. It's easy. Follow the instructions to see your very own daffodil flower come to life.

What you will need

- 1 x large paperclip
- Petal and trumpet templates
- Coloured textas, coloured paper, pencils or crayons (optional)
- Sticky tape or glue

Method

- 1. You can either ask your students to colour in their own daffodils or photocopy the templates provided onto coloured card or paper.
- 2. Cut out each petal shape and placing one on top of the other and using a hole punch, carefully pierce a hole in the middle of them.
- 3. Twist one set of petals so that you can see all 6 petals.
- **4.** Cut out the trumpet, and fold the cut-out into a cone shape. Make line A & B meet to form a straight edge and fix with clear tape.
- **5.** Fold the tab of the trumpet (C) in half and thread through holes in the petals securing at back with clear tape.
- **6.** You can sticky tape the flower to a surface or make a stem. You can bend the paperclip once to form an 'L' shape and thread one half through the paper trumpet & petals and the other half down into the stem.
- 7. Secure the trumpet with tape if required.
